## Charity

By doing loving acts of good charity, we mimic the Lord and grow more into His image and likeness in the course of our salvation journey, which is ultimately the whole meaning of our existence, living the Hope of eternal life with Him. And as we fulfil this spiritual trait and cause within ourselves, we become who we really are, true sons and daughters of God.

This is why such acts of Charity invokes such the positive and fulfilling feelings within us – it is who we are. I implore you my brethren to look deep within you and offer as much loving through charity. And Charity can be offered in many forms including donations of funds, time, effort or even promotion, but above all these – Prayer. Charity does not have to be given loudly and proclaimed publically – but simply being a loving family member, a friend, a comforter or even offering a smile in a time of distress. And if you are struggling to find an avenue, speak to your spiritual advisor who will offer you many opportunity to serve and offer loving Charity to many of the Lord's children who are part of the One Body of Christ.

May our Loving Lord grant you all peace and joy that you may experience the true meaning of Charity in and through Him, with Him, for Him and ultimately in Him.
